#### Introduction to the Liturgy of the Day

Today we hear Jesus invite his disciples, who have just returned from their mission, to travel with him to a deserted place to rest a while. Sounds like the perfect thing for us to do at this time of year! Even Jesus realized the need to rest and recharge. But then Jesus sees the crowds that sought him out, so he changes his plans and begins to teach them, for they were "sheep without a shepherd." May it comfort us to know that Jesus always has time for us. We need never feel lost or forsaken.

## JEREMIAH 23:4. ES **Reflection on the Gospel**

The apostles have just returned from their first attempts at teaching and expelling evil spirits, and it is likely that their report to Jesus is an enthusiastic retelling of all the marvels they found themselves able to do. Jesus invites them to a deserted place, the kind of place where he would customarily go apart to pray (Mark 1:35). This will help them experience more deeply the divine compassion that calls them into mission and that is the source of all that they are able to do.
